

# First impressions of the General Assembly

Our Treasurer Judith was one of our Commissioners at this year's General Assembly in Edinburgh. She writes:

'I would like to thank the Kirk Session for allowing me to attend the General Assembly as commissioner this year. I really appreciated the opportunity and enjoyed my experience.

The weekday worship was particularly powerful and our Moderator's reflections inspiring. The Assembly was addressed by various visitors during the week including Rev Lydia Neshangwe Moderator elect from South Africa, Chief Rabbi Ephraim Mirvis and First Sea Lord, Admiral Sir Ben Key. There was input to the debates from Christians from different denominations from the UK and abroad.

The breadth of the report by the Faith Impact Forum was incredible. In one day we listened to reports about the newly produced Jewish Christian Glossary, the legacy of slavery, net zero, the earthquake in Syria, Pakistan, Violence against women, cost of living, assisted dying and addictions. The most contentious issue was the church's position on assisted dying. The current position is that the church is against assisted dying in any circumstances. After a really heartfelt debate – which I contributed to - it was agreed that the issue would be looked into again and a new report produced for next year's assembly.

The debates were of a very high standard and the youth representatives were very impressive challenging the status quo.'
