Conflict in Sudan

We count it a privilege to have people with their roots in Sudan among our friends in the wider community. We have been hearing their distress as they worry for the safety of their relatives. One person said 'Today my family is under barrage of fire, from early morning until the present moment, in Omdurman, next to the Corps of Engineers, and behind the radio station, the two worst areas for incidents. Please pray for my family'. The news has drawn very near.

WHAT WOULD JESUS DRINK?

Starbucks are planning to build a drive-thru on the Co-op car park despite Glasgow City Council stating in November 2022 that no more would be built except in retail parks. There are two up the road at Crown Street. There has been little local consultation and as no-one with any real interest was informed on time, the plans are likely to be approved on the nod.

Gorbals Parish Church have submitted their objection as we believe that the resulting pollution, litter and increase in traffic are of detriment to the community. Round the corner G5 Cafe are locally run, serve freshly-made food, coffee and home-baking. They know their customers and are an asset to our community.

If Jesus was meeting with people in Gorbals today, we think you'd find him round the corner at G5 and not driving thru Starbucks with a disposable cup in His hand.
